<p>Description of Class: The SRTA course is the second of three units needed for people wanting to advance to the Technician Level for Water and Rope based rescues. This two day course has classroom instruction followed by hands-on skill development. It integrates techniques and skills learned in SRT1, as well as incident command level controls, all while in the midst of class III and above whitewater. There will be a night search as well as low to high angle rope work, which is the prerequisite for the TRR. Other topics covered include: preplanning, rescue and recovery management, problems associated with floods, raising and lowering systems, and much more.</p> <p>Prerequisites: SRT 1 class on May 11 to May 13.</p>	
<p>Instructor Bio: Chris Jonason, owner and operator of Wave Trek Rescue, has been involved in river and swiftwater rescue for the majority of her life. She owned and operated Wave Trek Inc., a rafting and kayaking company, very successfully for 26 years before she sold it to focus her energy exclusively on the rescue field. She has been rafting since the early 1980's in Washington, and all the United States as well other rivers around the world, including rivers in Africa and South America. She is an Instructor Trainer for the ACA in rafting, kayaking, and rescue in addition to being an Instructor Trainer for Rescue 3 International in whitewater and high to low angle rescue. Chris is involved in developing risk management for other high adventure recreation companies and organizations, rescue consulting for other companies and agencies, and has written curriculum for Rescue 3 and the ACA. Chris has also spent much of her life dedicated to the service of horses, be it training, shoeing, development, or rescue. She has a dynamic teaching style that makes her expertise and years of experience accessible to and rewarding for all students, be they novice rescuers or veteran professionals on the fields of swiftwater rescue, technical rope rescue, animal rescue, tower and motorized boat handling.</p>	
<p>Required Equipment: Full wetsuit or drysuit, a USCG approved life jacket, white water helmet, and booties or tennis shoes. Gloves and fins are optional. Students are encouraged to bring their own rescue gear to practice with. *If students need to rent gear packages they are available through Wave Trek Rescue. This includes wetsuit, helmet, booties and life jacket.</p>	
<p>Important Note: Your camping fee is included in this course fee. However MEALS are not included in the course fee. If you wish to have meals during the pre conference class you may purchase meal tickets upon arrival at the Conference Registration Tent. Meals are \$5.00 each.</p>
